Improvement	The student from this class who has made the greatest growth in one or more areas of learning.
Achievement	The student from this class who excels in one specific key learning area OR who demonstrates high performance and effort across key learning areas consistently throughout the year.

Rotary Club Citizenship	The student from Year 6 who demonstrates exemplary social and personal capability. They show care and respect for classmates, other students and our school. They respect difference and diversity. They may have contributed significantly through a community event or extra curricula activity.				
Excellence in Sport	The student from Year 6 who excels in Sport and has achieved outstanding results in one or more sporting domains throughout the year. This could include athletics, swimming, running, team or individual sports; representing the school, zone, area or state.				
Excellence in the Arts	The student from Year 6 who excels in the Arts and has achieved outstanding results in one or more domains throughout the year. This could include music, visual art, creative art, dance or drama.				
Excellence in Literacy	The student from Year 6 who demonstrates outstanding performance and effort across the key learning area of English and consistently demonstrates outstanding literacy skills throughout the year.				
Excellence in Numeracy	The student from Year 6 who demonstrates outstanding performance and effort across the key learning area of Maths and consistently demonstrates outstanding numeracy skills throughout the year.				
Excellence in Academia	The student from Year 6 who demonstrates outstanding performance and effort across key learning areas consistently throughout the year.				
School Captains	Awarded to the school captains for leadership and school service throughout the year				

Kinder and Year 6 all receive graduation certificates. Year 6 are presented at the Years 1-6 presentation assembly and Kinder at a special Early Stage 1 presentation assembly.

Learning Support awards: 1 award per grade for achievement or improvement




If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2026 or OC 2026, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

GIFTS FOR TEACHERS

The end of year is fast approaching. We know some of you may be thinking about purchasing a gift to say thank you to the staff. Whilst not expected, this is much appreciated. The Department of Education has very strict guidelines around the gifts teachers can and cannot accept. These are outlined in our Code of Conduct. To ensure our staff can accept the gift please make sure:

*Gifts are valued at \$50 or less (per child). *Combined/class gifts are best given in smaller amounts. The teacher must declare gifts over \$50 and provide a list of students from whom the gift was given. *No cash is given *No gift cards that can be redeemed for cash are given (e.g eftpos or Visa).

Read With Me Program

The Read With Me Program is designed to encourage and reward children for regular reading at home. This program is proudly jointly sponsored by our school and through P & C Bookclub. It is important for children to be read to, read with and also to read independently.

Children enter the date, title of the book and parents then sign. If your child is reading a larger book over a period of time, pages read can be indicated. Children read books from home, library books or home-readers.

We ask that each parent signature represents 15 minutes of reading for Kindergarten, Years 1 & 2 <u>OR</u> 20 minutes of reading for Years 3, 4, 5 & 6. For each 25 entries the teacher signs. When your child has read on 100 occasions, he/she will select a book as a reward. *Note: Only one entry per day is allowed/ counted.*

Final dates for rewards will be as follows: <u>Day 300 = from 1 December</u>. <u>Last day for trade ups 4 December</u>. After this the program will end and no more book prizes will be awarded. Please ensure you make a note of this final date to avoid disappointment.

Regular home reading is very beneficial and we encourage your support of the program.
