




Opportunity Class and Selective High School for 2026

Detailed instructions on how to apply and the link to the online form are at the Selective high schools and Opportunity classes Year 7 website. Applications are open now and close 21 February. You must apply before the closing date.

School attendance - information for parents



Start date for beginning of Term 1, 2025

Next year, all students will be starting school on **Thursday 6 February**, following 4 school development days. These school development days provide our teachers time to be best prepared individually and collectively to implement curriculum.

Students in Kindergarten in 2025 - the first day of Kindergarten for all Kindy students will be Thursday 6 February. **Students will start at 10am on this day only.** Further information about the first day of Kindergarten will be provided at Kinder orientation.

Students in Years 1-6 in 2025 - all students in Years 1-6 will return to school on Thursday 6 February. Students will start at 9:05am on this day. Students will return to temporary classes. Further information about the organisation for the return to school will be provided.

*If your child will be returning/coming to our school but will not be returning on this date, please email our office.

School development days will operate the way they always have. Students do not attend on these days as there are no timetabled lessons so staff can engage in professional development and planning.

NAPLAN 2025

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It is a nationwide assessment and provides information to parents/carers, teachers and schools about the development of literacy and numeracy skills in students.

Next year the NAPLAN test window runs from Wednesday 12 March 2025 to Monday 24 March 2025. Parents of students in Year 3 and Year 5 in 2025 may like to note these days to ensure school attendance for the tests.

Composite classes

Next year students will return to temporary classes for the first few weeks. This will enable us to settle all Kinder students and review our enrolments. Our school is staffed based on student enrolment numbers.

As you are aware, according to the plan of Department of Education demographers, our school catchment area has reduced. As such our school enrolments are also reducing. This means, that like in many schools, we will have composite classes. Whilst we will hold our usual composite class information session next year, please take the time to be informed early. This will help alleviate any concerns you may have. Many parents dislike composite classes but the evidence does not support their anxiety

Staffing in public schools is based on a staffing formula.

The formula governs how many staff the Department of Education gives the school.

The formula is:

Why is this formula used?

The formula comes from a class size reduction program introduced a number of years ago.

How are children selected for a composite class?

- Each class has the correct number of students based on DoE staffing formula and average class size numbers.
- There are mixture of boys and girls in each class.
- Each class has students with a mixture of abilities.

Classes are formed at Epping Heights PS to ensure balanced groups.

What does research say makes a difference and affects student learning?

Research suggests that:

- Class organisation "...will not determine either educational advantage or disadvantage..." (NSW DET 1997)
- The most important factors in determining student success are the quality of the teacher and his or her teaching. (Hattie, 2003)

Helper Inductions 2025

Parents and community members are valued as an integral part of Epping Heights Public School. There are numerous roles that parent and community volunteers can be involved in to support the school in its core business of improving learning outcomes for students. This includes being a parent helper in classrooms, on excursions, at sports carnivals, at school events, for band etc.

Our thorough helper induction process helps reassure all parents that everyone who volunteers in our school has been through a rigorous process and is safe, before working with our students.
