Parents are warmly invited to join us on Open Day. More information will be sent early next term.



## **Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking Competition**

On Thursday, June 22, 2023, the finalists of stage two and three of the Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking Competition gathered at Ngarala Public School for the Northern Sydney Local Final No.10. The event commenced with a warm welcome from Ms. Zadow, the school's Principal, and the adjudicator, James Smith.

The morning session began with the prepared speeches from the stage two participants. Representing EHPS admirably were Larry W. (4P) and Bella X. (4P). Larry delivered a thoughtful and well-researched speech titled "Racism - No Way!" while Bella explored the theme of "Sports Bringing Us Together" from various perspectives. Following the prepared speeches, the stage two students faced the challenge of delivering impromptu speeches. This proved more demanding as they had only five minutes to craft a 1 to 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>-minute talk on the topic of "Big Ideas."

In the afternoon session, the stage three students presented their prepared speeches. Representing EHPS were Sianne Y. (5A) and Jade S. (5A). Sianne delivered an engaging and well-developed speech titled "Identity - It's Complicated," while Jade spoke passionately about "Raising Your Voice" and the importance of taking action instead of remaining silent. The impromptu topic for stage three was the idiom "Better Late Than Never."

The adjudicator expressed his admiration for the overall quality of the prepared and impromptu speeches, praising the participants for their passionate and nuanced presentations. He particularly emphasised the impact of speeches that incorporated personal heartfelt stories and made organic connections.

Jade was honoured with one of the two "Highly Recommended" certificates for stage three, as her speeches were noted by the adjudicator as being delivered with much conviction.

The four finalists from Epping Heights Public School represented their school with great distinction, and they should feel immensely proud of their remarkable efforts.
