RECONCILIATION WEEK



ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Students are expected to have above a 95% school attendance rate, because days missed are years lost. That's why making sure your child comes to school every single day (unless genuinely sick) is so important.

Stage 2 lunch boxes experiment in science

In Stage 2 we have been learning about our Material World and insulation. In 3G we made lunch boxes by using materials to decorate. We also will keep an ice cube in the lunch boxes we made. The ice cube needs to stay solid in the lunchbox in the sun for 1 hour.

Our Research

The first time we did science, our class talked about a melting ice investigation and experimented with what would melt the ice the fastest – the sun through the window, salt, towel, room temperature water, warmth from our hands and our breath!

After 3G talked about which materials would leak, soak and repel, like cellophane, paper, sponge and tea towel. Then our class brainstormed about materials we wear in different places.

Keeping Ice Solid Experiment

We used ice cubes and some materials, for example: bubble wrap, foil, towel and one with no material, we also tried to predict what would happen if we wrapped an ice cube in each material. We predicted about ice cubes and saw which one melts the fastest. We found out that with the towel around the ice cube, the ice cube was still there!

Keeping Water Warm Experiment

Another time we put hot water in cups to see if it would keep warm wrapped in different materials. We also looked at the results for the towel and the hot water was still warm!

We did all this research work so at the time we were making our lunch boxes we would know what insulator to use, and we really enjoyed the whole process.



STAGE 2 EXCURSION

Stage 2 have been studying Community and Remembrance in history. To support the learning, students participated in an engaging excursion to Chinatown and the Chinese Garden of Friendship. Students discussed global and national celebrations and commemorations through hands-on activities and a tour of the gardens and Chinatown. Students learnt about the history of Chinese immigration, changes in the local community over time and gained an appreciation for the importance of cross-cultural understanding. Learning about chi and the flow of energy through the gardens, which were a gift from China to NSW, students heard about the purposeful design features and enjoyed the beauty of these amazing gardens. Throughout the day students looked for symbols such as dragons hidden in plain sight and discussed lucky symbols and the Year of the Rabbit. Students were very enthusiastic and creative while they cooperated in groups to craft a dragon and recreate a dragon dance.
