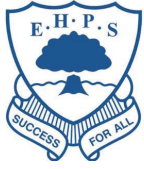

PLANNING FOR 2019

We are currently planning for the 2019 school year. It is important to let the school know if your child/children will be returning late to school next year. This will ensure a place will be kept for your child in a class for 2019. By informing the school of your return date in writing this will keep your position open. Applications for extended leave must be submitted for approval BEFORE travel takes place.

The first day for school students in Years 1-6 is Wednesday 30th January 2019. Kindergarten students will start on Thursday 31st January 2019 (*Note: Kinder start time will be 10a.m initially. More details will be provided at Kinder orientation*).

PARENT HELPERS

Community involvement is an essential part of our school culture, vision and school plan. Children flourish when surrounded by caring adults who support them in their goals. We are proud of the harmony that exists between staff, parents and the community. Each day we welcome helpers into classrooms, on excursions, for extra curricular activities and for the many services provided such as uniform shop and banking.



In order to ensure the upmost care and safety of students, staff and visitors to our school we have a very clear process for parents and community helpers.

This process involves annually signing the Parent and Community Helper Agreement located on our website. In addition to this we ask helpers to provide the appropriate documentation as per the Department of Education Probity Unit requirements. Links to requirements maybe found on our school website and can be downloaded and completed prior to coming to our school to make it easier. https://eppinghts-p.schools.nsw.gov.au/content/dam/doi/sws/schools/e/eppinghts-p/policies/2018_Parent_and_community_helper_agreementv2.pdf

Documentation as outlined in our agreement is only required once during the parent's time at our school. Appendix 5 may be emailed if witnessed by a JP. In this case, the volunteer must then bring the original documents to be sighted prior to their first helping session. For all parent helpers, we cannot verify WWCC anymore so Appendix 5 is the required documentation. This documentation is carefully stored and kept for seven years. If you have any questions about the documentation required, please contact our staff at the school office.

In addition to the documentation, in order to connect and build relationships with our helpers, we request an annual face-to-face parent induction. This session usually takes around half an hour and enables our community to hear the latest work, health and safety information to support themselves and our students in case of an emergency. Given some parent helpers offer their support outside of regular school hours, this is essential, as staff may not be on site at the time of an emergency. We also include information on supporting the identification of risks and hazards and reporting accidents to visitors. The session also covers requirements for child protection and offers support for what a helper should do if such a very sensitive situation should arise. The induction allows community members and parents to ask questions of staff and discuss scenarios they may face. In this way, whilst the same key messages are covered in each induction session, sessions are also tailored to meet the needs of particular groups or individuals. This local induction is a very important way for us to communicate, engage and support helpers as they work in collaboration to benefit our students and keep them safe.

This year we have held 7 sessions and have had positive feedback from many who have attended. They say that they feel greatly supported in their role as a helper. In order to ensure as many parents can help as wish to, we are holding an **induction this evening at 6:30p.m in the Library, as previously advertised.**

To further strengthen our connection with community, based on feedback, next year we will hold a number of inductions during the day and evening. Inductions will be held at key points in the year to support all those who wish to help.

Please note the following 2019 dates in your diary:

- 9:05a.m 15 February (for all helpers including Scripture and Ethics teachers)
- 6:30p.m 28 February (prior to initial band meeting for the year)
- Term 1 week 4- date and time to be confirmed (aligned to Meet the Teacher afternoon)
- 6:30p.m 12 March (prior to P & C)

We will also schedule 1 session in Term 2, 3 & 4 for any new parents to our school.

Any parents who wish to help but are unable to make one of these half hour inductions, should contact me directly. Please note the helper agreements and face-to-face induction are annual requirements i.e. once every 12 months.

We thank you for your ongoing support and involvement with our school.



INTERNET SAFETY

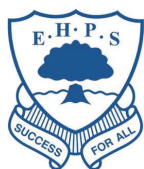

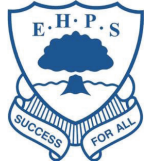
