Thank you again to the parents who donated to the gold coin challenge and voluntary contributions. Here you can see students in 1H using the new laptops.



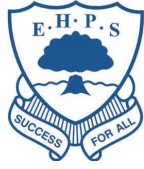
EARLY REPORTS

Due to the time required to ensure our reporting process is thorough and printing of over 530 reports is done accurately, we are unable to give student end of year reports early. **Reports will be sent home with students on Monday 17 December.** If you are unable to collect it then you can either provide the office with a stamped self-addressed envelope and we will post it home, or your child can collect it from the office next year.

2019 PLANNING

We are currently planning for the 2019 school year. It is important to let the school know if your child/children will be returning late to school next year. This will ensure a place will be kept for your child in a class for 2019. By informing the school of your return date in writing this will keep your position open. Applications for extended leave must be submitted for approval BEFORE travel takes place.

The first day for school students in Years 1-6 is Wednesday 30th January 2019. Kindergarten students will start on Thursday 31st January 2019. (Note: Kinder start time will be 10a.m initially.)

Compulsory School Attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

What are my legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. The *Education Act 1990* requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards for homeschooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An *Application for Extended Leave* may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.





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SAFETY

A number of parents have been seen by teachers driving into the school carpark before and after school times. For the safety of children who are involved in OSHC and other community user activities and staff who are still on site- **this is not allowed**. Please do not use staff carparks at any time. Please also take care when driving near the school grounds.

CAROLS NIGHT

We hope you can join us for Carols Night this Friday evening. Please see later in the newsletter for more information about this event. Just a reminder that parents are responsible for the safety and supervision of their own children. Children must be escorted by an adult to and from the toilets and should not be left unsupervised to play in the playground.

As per the Department of Education's Code of Conduct "You must not take alcohol to a school or consume it during school hours or at any school function at any time school students are present, including those events conducted outside school premises. A school function is any occasion organised by the school and/or in the school's name, including dances, farewells, excursions, sporting fixtures and fund raising events."

There will be a parent first aid officer on the night but parents are responsible for ensuring their own child's medical needs are attended to. We look forward to a safe and happy event.

Thank you! As the term draws to a close we bid farewell and thank you to Jenny Read, our Year 6 Ethics Teacher. Jenny has been involved with Primary Ethics since the inception of the program at our school, and a valued member of our Ethics teaching group.

Current topics This week, year 3 students are finishing their topic on whether some animals are more precious than others, and moving on to a critical thinking topic about drawing inferences. Year 5 students are finishing their topic on teasing, and starting a unit called Thinking about Thinking. Hopefully they might get time to discuss Drugs in Sport before the end of term! Children in all classes are working through the prescribed curriculum with great energy and enthusiasm.

New volunteers needed! Now is the perfect time to kick off your application and training to become an ethics teacher at our school in 2019! Ethics Teachers facilitate the children's conversations working from a prescribed curriculum. You receive training in classroom management as well as child protection and loads of tips on how to facilitate the lessons. 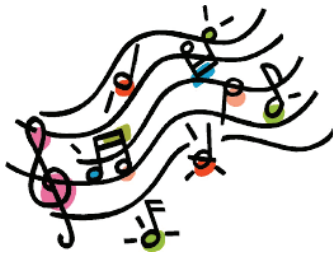

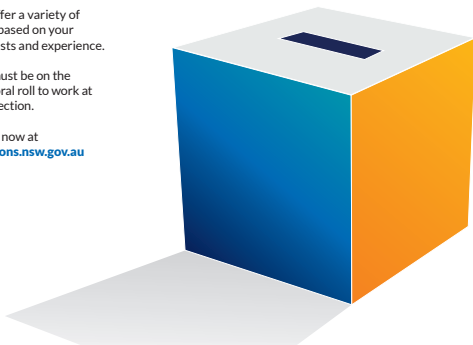

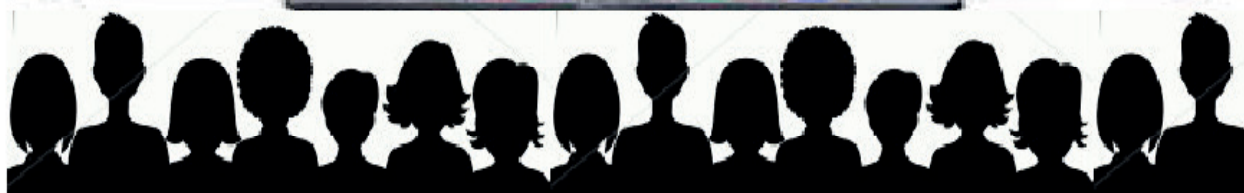
